# FABLED BEVERLY HILLS HOTEL GETS FACELIFT

The Pink Palace is still the place to see - and be seen - if money is no object

If you are here, you have arrived. No other hotel reflects the

glamour and indulgence of Hollywood as does the Beverly Hills Hotel and Bungalows, where movie moguls take meetings in the Polo Lounge and stars are massaged with diamond dust at La Prairie Spa.

The hotel is wrapping up a two-year restoration to every legendary space, including its 135 main-building rooms and suites. The venture is working. The Beverly Hills reported the best summer in its history in spite of protests against anti-gay policies by its owner in the Mideast, but the hotel's fans have returned in force.

As it approaches its 103rd year in 2015, the hotel is impeccably maintained and thoroughly modernized from pool to penthouse, boutique to ballrooms. The guest rooms are tech-forward with sensor buttons for lighting and heat, large flat-screens and bathroom mirrors with inset TVs. Guests curl up on divine, white customwoven sheets embroidered with the hotel's logo and the closets are spacious enough for a film star's wardrobe. The furniture is covered in soft leathers, nubby woollens and opulent silks, creating an exquisite, classic-contemporary look by influential Tihany Design.

The lobby's whimsical bananaleaf motif has been softened to serene neutrals, although tradition stays strong. The Beverly Hills is keeping famous features that have made it one of the most recognized hotels anywhere — the renowned pink exterior

and the splendid red-carpet entrance.

Charlie Chaplin, Greta Garbo and Marlene Dietrich were habitués, and Elizabeth Taylor celebrated six of her eight honeymoons at the Beverly Hills Hotel. (Liz's father had an art gallery in the hotel.)

Fast forward to successive generations of glitterati who chill at this timeless getaway: box-office kings include Brad Pitt, Tom Cruise, Billy Crystal, Channing Tatum, Leonardo di Caprio, Zac Ephron; screen queens include Sandra Bullock, Diane Keaton and Sharon Stone; and perhaps on separate days, Jennifer Aniston and Angelina Jolie.

As many as 40 car jockeys work during a dazzling Academy Awards party, when the lineup of chauffeur-driven Bentleys and Range Rovers stretches for blocks. The morning after the

The pink art deco landmark with its Spanish Revival bell towers are La-La Land attractions unto themselves, as historic and laden of mystique as the Hollywood sign or the MGM lion. And even you and I can experience the fabled Pink Palace with affordable indulgences.

The Asprey boutique is extravagant, but the hotel's Signature Shop is a gold mine of fun gifts. While spa treatments with diamonds and caviar are out of sight, a deluxe manicure for men or women is manageable.

The handsome Polo Lounge, recently spruced up in hunter green and mahogany, is where Spielberg and Scorsese sign deals. You can embrace the spirit and sip on The Envelope Please, a vodka-Champagne fizz spiked with flavours of honey, peach and lemon. The adorable retro Fountain Coffee Room is where Nicole Kidman and Catherine Zeta-Jones nibble lightly, perhaps on the Caviar Omelet or the Princess Salad.

#### BEST OF THE BEST

If you are a hotel guest, here are three incomparable experiences: **The posh pool:** It's not because Faye Dunaway, Mick Jagger and Paul McCartney swam here. It's because this is a sublime pool, surrounded by palms, lime trees and rose bushes and trellises of tropical vines. While you are lounging, attendants in pink shirts deliver iced treats like berry smoothies and mojito pops, and they stop by to clean your sunglasses and mist you with Evian spray.

The luxe bungalows: The secluded bungalows of the Beverly Hills Hotel are set amid luxuriant gardens of pink azaleas and scarlet bougainvillea. They're ultra-luxurious hideaways for elite travellers seeking a homey environment, that is, if home has a swimming pool and plush designer interiors. The newest bungalows have multiple bedrooms to accommodate children and entourages of nannies, personal trainers, chefs and hair stylists. **Cosmopolitan cuisine:** The hotel's newest in-room menu was designed for dining amid the splendour of the guest rooms and their terraces. Called the Taste of Dorchester Collection, it
