Victorian gym found buried in Scotland

Archeologists in Scotland have uncovered the remains of an outdoor 19th-century gym, complete with thrilling Victorian contraptions like the Great Sea Serpent. The Royal Patent Gymnasium was billed as The New Wonder of Edinburgh when it opened in the Scottish capital in 1865. It was designed to help factory workers keep their weight in check and featured devices such as the Sea Serpent, which was a circular platform that allowed 600 people to row simultaneously. The park also featured a pond with boats and a canoe, springboards, climbing poles and rotary ladders. In the winter there was ice skating. "I cannot think of anything else like it," project manager Phil Richardson told The Scotsman, describing it as more of a theme park than a gym. Archeologists say exercise machines on the site included a 100-foot-long see-saw that could lift 200 people 15 metres into the air before lowering them. There was also a "velocipede paddle merry-go-round" that seated up to 600 people who propelled it with their feet.

Ireland promotes Game of Thrones

The beady-eyed stares of bureaucrats at Belfast city hall have some competition — from three-eyed ravens. The animatronic birds have been installed around the municipal corridors of power in a social-media-driven stunt to promote the popular HBO show Game of Thrones and its Northern Ireland filming locations. Other show props let loose in the real world have included swords, daggers, maces and even a remote-controlled dragon's egg as part of the Tourism Ireland-HBO joint venture. "Fans will see these (props online), spiking their curiosity about the landscapes and locations featured in the series and inspiring them to come and explore them for themselves," the tourist body said, adding more stunts are planned to coincide with the next round of the fantasy series. Tourism Ireland is the third-largest tourism board in the world on Facebook after Australia and the U.S., the Irish Independent reported.

Dubai cracks down on praying drivers

Drivers in Dubai who pull to the side of the road to perform prayers are now feeling the wrath of the traffic cop. A spokesman for the Gulf state's General Department of Traffic said 284 tickets have already been handed out to bus drivers since the beginning of the month, and that 28 buses belonging to repeat offenders have been taken off the road. "We have noted this behaviour and have warned drivers against the dangers of stopping on the side of the road," Col. Saif Al Mazrouei told The National newspaper. "Patrols are cracking down on this phenomenon." He added: "Despite warnings, some are committing the same offence again, and this is why we impounded 28 buses." Anyone found praying at the side of the road faces a fine of up to \$330 and possible confiscation of their driver's licence.
