Ste. Rose du Nord is a six-hour drive from Montreal. Take Highway 40 or 20 to Quebec City, continue on Routes 73 and 175 north to Saguenay (Chicoutimi sector) and northeast on Route 172.

www.capauleste.com. Price: Mid-season: until July 15, and Aug. 21-Oct. 31, \$110 to \$140 per night for two (or \$180 in the junior suite), without meals. High season, July 15-Aug. 20, it's \$125 to \$160 for two (\$195 for the junior suite), without meals. With breakfast and supper, it's \$188 to \$218 per night for two (junior suite at \$258); in high season, it's \$203 to \$245 (junior suite at \$273), for two.
